### **Summer Reading Assignment**

In this course you will read extensively and write journal responses, timed in-class papers, and longer papers. As preparation you are to read **two** of the following three novels: *Oliver Twist*, *The Remains of the Day*, and *The Secret Life of Bees*. For each novel write a detailed response to the question indicated below. Each response must be typed and must be 1½ to 2 pages in length. In addition, in 1 typed page respond to the last question regarding the novels you read. Please note that you may use any of these novels as choices for your papers later in the course and that you are certainly free to read all of them if you choose to do so.

## **Oliver Twist** by Charles Dickens

Discuss the significance of the setting. When and where does the story seem to take place? What clues in the story did you use to determine the setting? Is the setting important to the story or could the story have taken place anywhere at any time? Does the setting have an effect on the characters?

# The Remains of the Day by Kazuo Ishiguro

Think of a situation that happens to a character in the story and decide whether you would do the same thing he/she does or something different. Evaluate what the character does and then write what you might do in the same situation. Think carefully about your decisions and justify your answer. Provide good textual analysis as you prepare your response.

# The Secret Life of Bees by Sue Monk Kidd

Identify the relationships of the characters in the story to one another (not just familial relationships). How do the characters' interactions with one another affect the story's outcome? Provide in-depth character analysis of the characters you choose to examine.

#### **Evaluation Question**

Think about the books you have read and tell which one you would recommend to a friend and why.
