

Final Grade Calculation

There have been numerous questions about grades and what will or will not count toward the final grade average and GPA. Hopefully, this will help clarify things because a Connect Ed message might not have been enough to completely explain things. So hopefully, this will clear things up and answer any open questions.

Marking Period 4

These grades stand. We were in school during this time period so the grades are what they are. The numeric grades will show on the report card and will be counted toward the final grade and GPA.

Marking Period 5

The grades on the report card will be numeric grades. If the numeric grade helps to improve the final grade average, the numeric value will be factored in to the final grade average and GPA. If a numeric grade does not help the final grade average, it will not count towards final grade average and GPA.

Marking Period 6

The teachers will submit numeric grades. The guidance counselor and the principal will review each students' grades and designate a P for Pass or F for fail. If the numeric grade helps the final grade average, the numeric number will be factored into the final grade average and GPA even though the grade will be designated as Pass. If the numeric grade from the teacher does not help the final grade average, that particular grade will not count toward the final grade average and GPA. The Pass / Fail designation is the result of state regulations.

Cumulative rank and GPA will be listed on the final report card.
