## **New NHS addendums for Fall of 2022**

\*\*\*\* New addition as of April 2022. (This will be used beginning in the Fall of 2022 and beyond.)

There will be a zero-tolerance policy for applicants and members regarding cheating, lying, and plagiarism during their high school careers. If there are any formal write-ups (minor or major) in these categories for the applicant prior to applying, the applicant will not be accepted. If the member acts in a manner resulting in the receipt of one of these discipline referrals, the member will be removed without a formal review due to the seriousness of these offenses. These offenses are the antithesis of an NHS member and cannot be tolerated by the NHS.

There will be a zero-tolerance policy for applicants and members regarding attendance in school. If an applicant or member has received or receives a major referral for tardies to school without formal excuses, the applicant will not be accepted, or the member will be removed from the NHS due to not having the proper character of an NHS member. This policy will apply to absences as well. If an applicant or a member have received a letter due to a high number of absences for a semester, the applicant will not be accepted, or the member will be removed from the NHS.

## National Honor Society

**Scholarship:** The standard for scholarship for the Palmerton National Honor Society Chapter is:

- Cumulative grade point average of 3.8 or better (A student will not be accepted in the chapter with less than a 3.8 GPA). A student cannot have failed a class in high school or in a dual-enrollment class, even if he/she has a 3.8 GPA or higher.

**Leadership:** The student exercises leadership:

- Is resourceful in proposing new problems, applying principles, and making suggestions
- Demonstrates initiative in promoting school activities
- Exercises positive influence on peers and upholding school ideals
- Contributes ideas that improve the civic life of the school
- Is able to delegate responsibilities
- Exemplifies positive attitudes
- Inspires positive behavior in others
- Demonstrates academic initiative
- Successfully holds school offices or positions of responsibility; conducts business effectively and efficiently; demonstrates reliability and dependability
- Is a leader in the classroom, at work, and in other school or community activities
- Is thoroughly dependable in any responsibility accepted
- Is willing to uphold scholarship and maintain a loyal school attitude

**Service:** The student who serves

- Volunteers and provides dependable and well organized assistance, is gladly available, and is willing to sacrifice to offer assistance
- Works well with others and is willing to take on difficult or inconspicuous responsibilities
- Cheerfully and enthusiastically renders any requested service to the school
- Is willing to represent the class or school in inter-class and inter-scholastic competition
- Does committee and staff work without complaint
- Participates in some activity outside of school, for example, Girl Scouts, Boy Scouts, church groups, volunteer services for the elderly, poor or disadvantaged
- Mentors persons in the community or students at other schools
- Shows courtesy by assisting visitors, teachers and students

\*Service is not based on classroom work, projects, or activities for which grades or pay is given

**Character:** The student of character

- Takes criticism willingly and accepts recommendations graciously
- Consistently exemplifies desirable qualities of behavior (cheerfulness, friendliness, poise and stability)
- Upholds principles of morality and ethics
- Cooperates by complying with school regulations concerning property, programs, office, halls, etc.
- Demonstrates the highest standards of honesty and reliability
- Regularly shows courtesy, concern, and respect for others
- Observes instructions and rules, is punctual, and faithful both inside and outside the classroom
- Has powers of concentration, self-discipline, and sustained attention as shown by perseverance and application of studies
- Manifests truthfulness in acknowledging obedience to rules, avoiding cheating in written work, and showing unwillingness to profit by the mistakes of others
- Actively helps rid the school of bad influences or environment

# National Honor Society – Palmerton High School Chapter

## Service Requirement for Members

The following outlines the minimum service requirement for National Honor Society members, which was put into effect for the members of 2008-2009 school year and beyond:

- I. **Required Activities** – all member must participate in the following activities:
  - a. Bloodmobile – Junior and Senior Year
  - b. Easter Day Care Program – Senior Year
  - c. Letters to Santa – Senior Year
  - d. Tutoring at Palmerton Area Library
  - e. Babysitting at Towamensing Elementary and S.S. Palmer Elementary
    - i. At least three times during Senior Year and Twice during Junior Year

\*\* All members are expected to participate in all of the above service activities as well as NHS induction. If you cannot participate in one of these activities because of some extenuating circumstances, you must inform a NHS advisor prior to the activity. \*\*

- II. **Other Activities** – all members must fulfill at least ten hours of service from no less than five of the activities below. These hours of service must be accomplished by the end of March of your senior year.
  - a. Freshman Orientation (Aug)
  - b. Community Festival Art Show (Sept)
  - c. NJHS Induction (Sept)
  - d. Tutoring (All year)
  - e. Meet the Teacher Night (Sept and Feb)
  - f. Senior Games (May)
  - g. Jazz Fest (Spring)
  - h. Family Fun Day (May)
  - i. Senior Awards (May)
  - j. Graduation (June)
  - k. 5K Run (May)

\*\*\*There may be other activities that get added to this list. Ideas for other service projects for our organization to help the community and school are always welcome. Make sure the activities are acceptable before you begin your service project.\*\*\*

- III. Service is considered some act that is done for the benefit of others in the community or school. Therefore, fundraisers are NOT considered service since they only serve the purpose of service to us. ALL members are expected to take part in fundraisers.
- IV. Members are responsible for recording their own service hours in the logbook held by the advisor.
- V. Members who have completed six or less service hours by September will be issued a written warning of their status in the National Honor Society. If the student does not fulfill his/her service hours by the end of March in the senior year, the member may be dismissed by vote of the Faculty Council. A written warning will also be given whenever a member's GPA drops below a 3.8.
- VI. Students who are selected as seniors must participate in all required activities scheduled after induction, including babysitting twice for Towamensing PTO.
